• Rotaract

• Rotary Youth Leadership Award

• New Generations Service Exchange in District 2452

Under the oversight of District Youth Service committee and the leadership of DG Michel Jazzar and DGE Shawkat Tadros a first exchange is planned between Lebanon and Jordan that will allow to develop highly customized experiences that meet the needs of young adults in our district.

• Interact

Our firsthand experience with Interact Clubs confirms that Interact are the foundation and immediate succession into Rotaract. While, we help bring together young people ages 12-18 to develop leadership skills while discovering the power of Service Above Self, we are investing in the long-term sustainability of Rotary. As Rotary Club sponsors, let us work together to empower Interact Youth by providing mentorship and guidance as they carry out projects, develop leadership skills and gain a global perspective. As district team we are confident that sponsoring an Interact Club will not only challenge Interactors to reach their full potential, it will also energize and inspire your Rotary club while building connections in the community and around the world.

• EarlyAct

The EarlyAct committee is working hard to assist Rotary clubs in creating wide service club for elementary students from ages 7 to 12. While EarlyAct are not an official RI program but the mission and operation of these clubs are closely linked to the ideals of Rotary and it is the district team's belief that it will help provide the foundation and natural succession into Interact. The DG has appointed an EarlyAct Representative, PP Litsa Aresti in Cyprus and Rotarian Samer Slim in Lebanon, to lead this initiative and assist clubs in the formation of new EarlyAct clubs.

• Joint Service Events:

Rotarians are needed to give the young leaders the experience of seeing Rotary in action and invite them to organize a service event to act on an issue that matters in your community. Help align projects with the District Areas of Focus to promote civic education, peace, or improve access to clean water. Did you know that grants can be used to support Rotary's programs for young leaders? District grant eligibility includes Rotaract, RYLA, Interact, and other youth activities. Talk to the leadership team about how district funds can advance these programs, support youth-led service projects, and connect young people to new Rotary opportunities.

While Rotary Clubs will be recognized and rewarded based on innovative actions and achievements in implementing District 2452 theme "Youth Is Our Future", the District Youth and District Theme committees are committed to support all initiatives with the aim to strengthen youth service, engage young people in service to make a difference, and connect young leaders to other Rotary experiences like Interact, Rotaract, RYLA and Youth Exchange.
